Jonathan and Marian Frerichs - sharing stories about their adventures in PNG and around the world.

Ruth Van Reken - will lead sessions on Friday and Saturday. One session will focus on attachment issues and related trauma that TCK's often experience. A small group opportunity on Saturday will focus on ways to cope. Ruth enjoys meeting all attendees - so plan on chatting with her during a meal or open time.

George Weiblen - is excited about traveling to PNG this month - the first time since COVID. On Friday evening, he will be joined (via Zoom) by Maling Rimandai who works at their research station in Madang. He is a graduate of Good Shepherd Lutheran High School in Baitabag and recently from Martin Luther Seminary in Lae. From 2007-2016, they studied rainforest plants and insects in remote locations across PNG. You can check out the Research Center's website here - <https://www.ngbinatang.com/>. On Saturday he plans to share samples of his collections from PNG, and describe the sustained effort by local landowners to reserve a large tract of their forest estate in spite of the pandemic. In a small group setting, he'll discuss safe travel options with those who consider visiting there. We are excited to announce that George plans to stay overnight with us on Friday.

Once again, this year's Reunion will have a *Service of Remembering Loved Ones*. A couple changes will enhance the service.



This is a book that gives insight into how our boarding school and mission-focused childhoods impacted our lives in many different ways.



Where do you live? Urbandale, Des Moines, Iowa is now my home.

What kind of work did you do? I retired in September of 2021 from 45 years in Parish Ministry as an ordained pastor.

What did your parents do? They served as missionaries for 26 years in Papua New Guinea, from 1946-1972. My dad, Alfred, served as a circuit missionary at Nobonob, 1946-1950; Headmaster at Baitabag Area School, 1950-1961; district missionary at Madang, 1962; Evangelism school at Amron 1963-1965; Editor of the New Guinea Lutheran 1966-1972; Parish/interim pastor and Nursing Home ministry in Minnesota and Iowa, 1973-2017. He also had a hobby of researching different shapes of crosses for the varied symbolisms they contained. He enjoyed writing up his findings and sharing them with different church groups.

My mom, Marion, worked by his side, and while at Baitabag, was the chief mimeographer of Sunday School lessons for all the mission stations of the Lutheran Mission. She also taught ESL for students at Baitabag who wanted to improve their use of English. Sewing classes and Bible studies for NG women in the various stations they lived at were also part of her life. Her proudest accomplishment was raising four sons.



Where do you live? Hugo, Minnesota has been home for my husband, Gary, and me since 1977. I was determined to stay in one spot and not move again!

What kind of work did you do? I had a wonderful 40-year career as a registered nurse at Regions Hospital in St Paul, MN, retiring in 2017. Presently, I love being with family and friends, playing pickleball, and volunteering at church and with our local historical commission.

What did your parents do? They arrived in PNG in 1948, spent a year in Ogelbeng with the Doerings, and then a year in Kerowagi when the Hannemans went on furlough. In 1951, Dad built the station at Banz and they remained there until leaving in 1967. Mother worked hard, taking care of the needs of the station and seven kids! She was the glue that held us all together. After returning to the US, Dad took Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE), then worked as a counselor at several places including Lutheran Social Service in Minneapolis, Hazelden Treatment Center, and the Women's Prison in Shakopee, MN. After Dad retired in 1992, they moved to warmer climates in Texas, and took long trips in their travel trailer, visiting friends and family throughout the US.
