Professor George Weiblen just returned last week from a scoping visit to PNG for his proposed **"Wokabout Wantaim Wantoks"**. Tentative dates are set for 7-21 September so that participants might share their experiences at the reunion in October.

George had a wonderful experience in PNG except upon returning from the 'bush' to learn that his public lecture sponsored by the US Embassy in Port Moresby was cancelled and his USAID proposal was paused by executive order from the Trump administration. With the change in US diplomacy, support from wantoks on wokabout could be critical in sustaining his humanitarian & environmental work in Madang. Topic:

"Birds and People in New Guinea: Constructive Paranoia"

Jared Diamond is an author, researcher, and teacher of Geography at UCLA. He met the Mesplay family at Karimui in 1964 while on his first trip to New Guinea to study birds. They shared interests and enjoyed many happy hours playing music and discussing all things New Guinea. Over the past 60 years, Jared returned to New Guinea 20 times, always to a different area. While studying in different regions, he was frequently the only European in a village. He commented, "Once you've been to New Guinea, the rest of the world is boring."

We will be hearing about his research of the birds of Papua New Guinea and how and why he coined the term 'constructive paranoia.'

His last visit to Papua New Guinea was in 2007 and his last visit to Indonesia New Guinea was in 2019. Recent projects involved designing natural park systems for the governments of New Guinea, Indonesia and the Solomon Islands.

He is a prolific writer and renowned author and was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for his 1997 book, *'Guns, Germs and Steel'*. He suggests reading his 2012 book, *'The World Until Yesterday'* which deals with PNG and other traditional societies.
